Sir:

I regret to report that Mary Kinninook, an Alaskan girl, died in the school hospital on Monday morning, Decr. 28, 1908.

I respectfully report further that this girl was admitted to the school on Oct. 24, 1903, at the age of nine years. At the expiration of her five year term she did not desire to go to her home and was readmitted for a term of one year. On Nov. 12, 1908 she was admitted to the school hospital with a well developed case of pulmonary tuberculosis and declined rapidly, which also was the cause of her death.

Her body was interred in the school burying ground and funeral services were conducted by a minister from town and in the presence of the entire student body on the afternoon of Decr. 28, 1908.

Her parents have been notified by wire.
