Sir:

I have to report the death this morning at the school hospital of Fred War Bonnet, a pupil of the Sioux tribe, aged 17 years, who came here from Rosebud Agency, S.D., October 4, 1907. Acute tuberculosis was the cause of death and the boy had been in the school hospital about four weeks. Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon and the remains will be interred in the school cemetery.

The U.S. Indian Agent, Rosebud Agency, S.D., has been notified of the death, by wire, with request that the guardian of the boy be advised.
