
### *To the Outing Patrons of the Carlisle School:*

The many bad results coming from the too free use of money given to our students by patrons, demand greater restriction upon the liberty of both pupils and patrons in money matters.

It is well established by our experience that liberality on the part of patrons is the prime cause for many boys running away from their country homes and for their committing other offences which have brought them into prolonged trouble.

I therefore deem it best to take absolute control of all Outing earnings as I do of students' money at the School, and hereafter patrons will not give to students under their care any money whatever except on regular request papers which will be first sent here for the approval of the Superintendent in charge.

A record of such approvals and amounts will be kept at the School, and any money given to students except on the approval of the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent will not be considered as part pay.
