Dear Doctor Agnew.

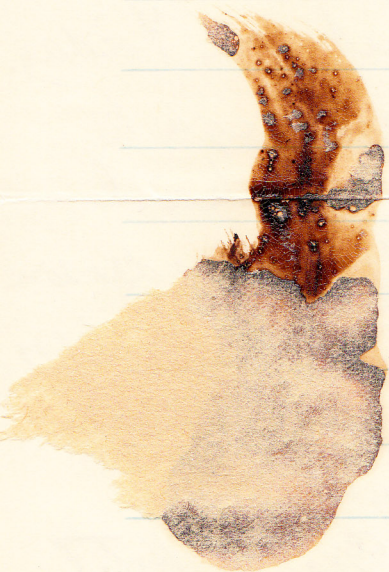
I can handle my school and its affairs after a fashion but my Board of Trustees are quite beyond my capacity. Mr Fox was the only foreign member present on Friday.
