Your October 1 letter requested biographical information on Thomas Collins and Oscar H. Lipps.

Records show that Thomas Collins was born September 6, 1897 at Norfolk, Virginia. He attended Clarks Prep School, Norfolk, Virginia and the District of Columbia Teachers College, Washington, D.C.

During the period August 2, 1922 to July 15, 1924, Mr. Collins was employed under Navy contract as Teacher and Superintendent of Public Instruction for the U. S. Naval Government of Guam. On that assignment he helped reorganize and grade the public school system for the Government of Guam.

On application for employment submitted in 1935, Mr. Collins indicates that from 1926 to 1933 he operated a boarding institution in San Diego County, California for problem boys and young men. From 1934 to 1935, he was employed by California Transient Service as Director of two shelters and seven labor camps in Imperial and San Diego Counties, California, and Director for Los Angeles Area Transient Service consisting of four shelters and eight labor camps. He organized the routine for operation of the Los Angeles shelter for 1000 men.

Thomas Collins was employed by the Resettlement Administration and Farm Security Administration as follows:

From November 1, 1935 to December 15, 1935, as Migrant Camp Manager, Marysville, California;

From December 16, 1935 to February 28, 1937, as Migrant Camp Manager, Arvin Migrant Camp, California;

From March 1, 1937 to April 19, 1937, as Community Manager at Large, San Francisco, California;

From April 20, 1937 to August 24, 1938, as Community Manager at Large, Gridley, California;

### 2. (Thomas Collins continued)

From August 25, 1938 to March 24, 1939, as Community Manager at Large, Thornton, California;

From March 25, 1939 to March 31, 1940, as Community Manager at Large, Calipatria, California;

From April 1, 1940 to December 31, 1940, as Camp Manager, Migratory Labor Camp, Thornton, California;

From January 1, 1941 to April 30, 1941, as Camp Manager, Migratory Labor Camp, Winters, California.

Mr. Collins resigned April 30, 1941, to look for other employment.

He became acquainted with John Steinbeck while stationed at Arvin, California and is said to have furnished much material for Steinbeck's novel, "Grapes of Wrath."

Records show that Mr. Collins, his wife Nancy, and their infant child returned to the United States in 1924 after his tour of duty on Guam. No other pertinent information regarding his family is shown in employment records here.

Oscar H. Lipps was born in the State of Indiana on July 8, 1872.

He received his education from elementary schools in Indiana and Tennessee, prepatory school, in Tennessee, U. S. Grant University, Athens, Tenn., American University, Harriman, Tenn., Summer Normal School, Rogersville, Tennessee, and Sprague Law School, Detroit, Michigan. Mr. Lipps served in the 22nd Infantry, U. S. Army from May 18, 1891 to June 24, 1893, and taught in the Post School. Other work experience prior to civilian Federal employment includes elementary and high school teacher in Tennessee, and Instructor in Latin and English at Evergreen College, Louisians.

Oscar Lipps was employed by the U. S. Indian Office and Bureau of Indian Affairs as follows:

From February 1, 1898 to May 23, 1900, as Teacher, Indian School, Uintah, Utah;

From May 24, 1900 to June 14, 1900, as Superintendent, same school;

From June 15, 1900 to July 31, 1901, as Superintendent, Indian Boarding School, Red Lake, Minnesota;

### 3. (Oscar H. Lipps continued)

From August 1, 1901 to January 27, 1904, as Superintendent, Indian Boarding School, White Earth, Minnesota;

From Jan. 28, 1904 to August 3, 1906, as Acting Superintendent, Chilocco Indian Training School, Oklahoma;

From August 4, 1906 to December 23, 1906, as Superintendent, Wahpeton Indian School, Indiana;

From December 24, 1906 to October 19, 1909, as Superintendent, Ft. Lapuai Indian School, Idaho;

From October 20, 1909 to May 12, 1911, as Supervisor of Indian Schools, Office of Indian Affairs (included special assignments to various Indian Schools);

From May 13, 1911 to March 16, 1913, as Supervisor of Farming, Office of Indian Affairs;

From March 17, 1913 to June 30, 1915, as Supervisor of Indian Schools, Office of Indian Affairs;

From July 1, 1915 to March 31, 1917, as Superintendent, Carlisle Indian School, Carlisle, Pennsylvania;

From April 1, 1917 to January 11, 1920, as Chief Supervisor of Indian Schools, Office of Indian Affairs;

From January 12, 1920 to April 30, 1926, as Superintendent, Fort Lapwai School, Sanatorium & Agency, Idaho;

From May 1, 1926 to April 30, 1931, as District Superintendent, District #5, Idaho, Oregon and Washington, with headquarters at Fort Lapwai, Idaho and Chemewa, Oregon;

From May 1, 1931 to July 31, 1935, Superintendent, Sacramento Indian Agency, California;

From August 1, 1935 to December 31, 1935, Supervisor, Emergency Conservation Work, Sacramento Indian Agency, California;

From January 1, 1936 to June 21, 1937, as Field Representative, Bureau of Indian Affairs;

From June 22, 1937 to July 31, 1937, as Field Representative, Indian Service at Large, Salem, Oregon;

### 4. (Oscar H. Lipps continued)

Mr. Lipps retired (Age) on July 31, 1937. His home address at that time was 365 North 13th Street, Salem, Oregon. March 1966 inquiry from Chemawa Indian School, indicated that Mr. Lipps was still living, presumably in Oregon.

Very little is known of Mr. Lipps family, however, records show his wife's name was Maude and there were four or more children in the family.







# Memorandum concerning Oscar H. Lipps

Mr. Lipps is forty-three years old, is married and a legal resident of Tennessee.

He entered the Indian Service as a teacher in 1898 at the Uintah School, Utah, and was appointed Super-intendent of that school in 1900. In 1904 he was made Assistant Superintendent of the Chilocco School, Oklahoma. In 1909 he was appointed Supervisor of Indian Schools, in 1911 Supervisor of Farming, and in 1913 reappointed Supervisor of Indian School, which is his present title. He receives a salary of \$2,500 per year.

In selecting a man to assume charge, temporarily, of the Carlisle School in February 1914, when Mr. Friedman was suspended from duty at that school, I considered Mr. Lipps the best qualified man in the Service for this purpose. He has now been in charge of the school for more than a year.

At the time he took charge chaos reined throughout

the institution. He found disorganization, rebellion, immorality and disloyalty. A recent inspection at this school showed that these unsatisfactory conditions have been almost entirely eliminated, that Mr. Lipps has thoroughly systematized the whole institution, and that while conditions are not ideal or perfect he has unquestionably demonstrated his qualifications to bring this institution up to a high standard of efficiency.

I am confident that he is the best available man to be placed permanently in charge of this school and that his appointment will be approved generally by the Indians and the public.



He was Superintendent of the Red Lake Boarding School from July 1900 to July 1901; Superintendent of the White Earth Boarding School, July 1901 to February 1904; Assistant Superintendent Chilocco School, February 1904 to 1906; Superintendent Wahpeton School, \$1500, 1906; Superintendent Nez Perce Indian Reservation, 1906 to July 1, 1909, \$1600; promoted July 1, 1909, to \$1700; appointed Supervisor of Indian School, October 20, 1909, at \$1800 and \$3 per diem; promoted April 1, 1910, to Supervisor of Indian Schools at \$2500 per annum and \$3 per diem. On May 13, 1911, Mr. Lipps was made Supervisor of Farming in the Indian Service at the same salary.

Mr. Lipps has an extremely good record in the Indian Service. He was placed in charge of all Five Civilized Tribes school matters at the time of the relief of Superintendent Bennett in 1909, and reorganized that work. His work

during the last two years has been primarily along industrial lines. Under the new policy of field supervision districts are assigned to supervisors who, within that district, have charge of all the various branches of Indian work, including not only industrial but school and agency work.

In view of the enlargement of Mr. Lipps' duties, it is deemed advisable that he should no longer be paid from the appropriation "Industrial Work, Care of Timber, 1913" but rather from the appropriation "Support of Indian Schools, 1913". His commission is therefore prepared to make this change.



The Act of Congress approved May 29, 1908, (35 Stat. L., 444), provides in part as follows:

That the lands, or any part thereof, allotted to any Indian, or any inherited interest therein, which can be sold under existing law by authority of the Secretary of the Interior, except the lands in Oklahoma, and the States of Minnesota and South Dakota may be sold on the petition of the allottee, or his heirs, on such terms and conditions and under such regulations as the Secretary of the Interior may prescribe; and the lands of a minor, or of a person deemed incompetent by the Secretary of the Interior to petition for himself. may be sold in the same manner, on the petition of the natural guardian in the case of infants, and in the case of Indians deemed incompetent as aforesaid, and of orphans without a natural guardian, on petition of a person designated for the purpose by the Secretary of the Interior.

I have the honor to recommend that Oscar H. Lipps, Superintendent of Fort Lapwai Indian School, Idaho, be designated as the proper person to petition for the sale of Indian lands, in whole or in part, belonging to minors without a natural guardian, and Indians deemed incompetent to petition for themselves, who are under his jurisdiction.
