EXPRINCTS FROM THE ACT OF MAY 30, 1930

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Section 1 of the act of May 29, 1930, provides in part as follows:

All employees to whom this Act applies who, before its effective date, shall have attained, or shall thereafter attain, the age of seventy years and rendered at least fifteen years of service, computed as prescribed in section 5 of this Act, shall be eligible for retirement on an annuity as provided in section 4 hereof: Provided, That city, rural, and village letter carriers, post office clerks, sea-post clerks, employees of the Indian Service at large excepting clerks, laborers, and mechanics generally, shall, under like conditions, be eligible for retirement at sixty-five years of age, and that railway postal clerks, mechanics, and laborers in navy yards, including leading men and quartermen but excluding master mechanics and foremen, and those employees engaged in pursuits whose occupation is hazardous or requires great physical effort, or which necessitates exposure to extreme heat or cold, and those employees whose terms of service shall include fifteen years or more of such service rendered in the Tropics, shall be eligible at sixty-two years of age. * * * *

shall be eligible at sixty-two years of age. * * * * All employees to whom this Act applies, who would be eligible for retirement from the service upon attaining the age of seventy years, sixty-five years, or sixty-two years, as the case may be, shall, after attaining the age of sixty-eight years, sixty-three years, and sixty years, respectively, and having rendered at least thirty years' service, computed as provided in section 5 of this Act, be eligible for retirement on an annuity as provided in section 4 of this Act. Retirement under the provisions of this paragraph shall be at the option of the employee; but if such option is not exercised prior to the date upon which the employee would otherwise be eligible for retirement from the service, the provisions of this Act with respect to automatic

separation from the service shall apply.

Section 4 provides as follows:

The annuity of an employee retired under the provisions of the preceding sections of this Act shall be a life annuity, terminable upon the death of the annuitant and shall be composed of: (1) A sum equal to \$30 for each year of service not exceeding thirty: Provided, that such portion of the annuity shall not exceed three-fourths of the average annual basic salary, pay, or compensation received by the employee during any five consecutive years of allowable service at the option of the employee and (2) the amount of annuity purchaselle with the sum to the average individual account as provided in secand (2) the amount of annuity purchasable with the sum to the credit of the employee's individual account as provided in section 12 (a) hereof, together with interest at 4 percentum per annum, compounded on June 30 of each year, according to the experience of the civil-service retirement and disability fund as may from time to time be set forth in tables of annuity values experience of the civil-service retirement and disability fund as may from time to time be set forth in tables of annuity values by the Board of Actuaries: Provided, that the total annuity paid shall in no case be less than an amount equal to the average annual basic salary, pay, or compensation, not to exceed \$1,600 per aunum, received by the employee during any five consecutive years of allowable service, at the option of the employee, multiplied by the number of years of service, not exceeding thirty years, and divided by forty: And provided further, That any employee at the time of his retirement may elect to receive in lieu of the life annuity herein described, an increased annuity of equivalent value which shall carry with it a proviso that no unexpended part of the principal upon the annuitant's death shall be returned. For the purposes of this Act all periods of service shall be computed in accordance with section 5 hereof, and the annuity shall be fixed at the nearest multiple of twelve. The term "basic salary, pay, or compensation," wherever used in this Act, shall be so construed as to exclude from the operation of the Act all bonuses, allowances, overtime pay, or salary, pay, or compensation given in addition to the base pay of the position as fixed by law or regulation.

of the position as fixed by law or regulation.

Section 5 provides as follows:

Subject to the provisions of section 9 hereof, the aggregate period of service which forms the basis for calculating the amount of any benefit provided in this Act shall be computed from the date of original employment, whether as a classified or an unclassified employee in the civil service of the United States, or in the service of the District of Columbia, including periods of service at different times and in one or more departments, branches, or independent offices, or the legislative branch of the Government, and also periods of service performed overseas under authority of the United States, and periods of honorable service in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard of the United States; in the case of an employee, however, who is eligible for and elects to receive a pension under any law, or retired pay on account of military or naval service, or compensation under the War Risk Insurance Act, the period of his military or naval service upon which such pension, retired pay, or compensation is based shall not be included, but nothing in this Act shall be so construed as to affect in any manner his or her right to a pension, or to retired pay, or to compensation under the War Risk Insurance Act in addition to the annuity herein provided.

In computing length of service for the purposes of this Act all periods of separation from the service, and so much of any leaves of absence as may exceed six months in the aggregate in any calendar year, shall be excluded, except such leaves of absence granted employees while receiving benefits under the United States Employees' Compensation Act, and in the case of

substitutes in the Postal Service credit shall be given from date of original appointment as a substitute.

In determining the aggregate period of service upon which the annuity is to be based, the fractional part of a month, if any, in the total service shall be eliminated.

INSTRUCTIONS IN REGARD TO EXECUTING APPLICATION

This application should be filled out, witnessed, subscribed, and sworn to before some officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes. If such officer is not required by law to have and use a seal, his official character, signature, and term of office must be certified by the proper State, county, or city officer under his official seal unless a certificate has already been filed in the Veterans Administration for general reference.

After execution the application should be forwarded to the head of the department or independent establishment of the Government where the claimant was last employed for completion of the certificate on the third page hereof. This certificate must, in the case of the executive departments, be made by the head of the department or by one of the assistant heads, and in the case of an independent establishment of the Government not within the jurisdiction of a department, it must be made by the head or acting head of such establishment. A chief of a division or the head of a bureau is not recognized as having authority to sign the certificate. If, however, the head of a department or independent establishment delegates the authority to sign certificates to a subordinate officer, the Veterans Administration will accord full faith and credence to such certificates.

If the tabulation of service in the certificate of the head of the department or independent establishment (question 6) includes service rendered in some other branch of the Government, the certifying officer should state that such record is based upon a duly certified abstract furnished by the office concerned.

Questions must be answered in full and the answers written in ink, or preferably be typewritten. When the application is complete it should be forwarded by the head of the department or independent establishment concerned to the Veterans Administration, Washington, D. C. U. S. 

Dear Sir:

Pursuant to letter dated June 27, 1933, order #3089, from your Department signed by Mr.J. Atwood Maulding, Chief, Division of Appointments, Mails and Files, I am inclosing herewith my application on form 3.R.l, for retirement benefit under existing law.

I hereby elect and request that the rate of pay for the annuity hereby applied for be determined by my last three years of service, July 1, 1930 to June 30, 1933 at \$1440 per annum and the last two years of my service under a classified service position ending August 31, 1918 at \$90 per month.

Justification.

On October 9, 1913, I was ordered by wire by Indian Office to report for duty to Department of Justice at Detroit, Minnesota who were prosecuting the White Earth land fraud cases. My official position or designation was changed by this order from Over-seer on Timber Matters, Leech Lake Agency, Minnesota to Clerk under Mr. J. H. Hinton, Special Agent, Detroit, Minnesota. The reason for my transfer was that at the suggesttion of the Indians interested in the land fraud cases, the Department of Justice deemed my services as interpreter for Indian witnesses before the trial Court was important. My duties as clerk were varied, both clerical and field work so that my salary at \$900 per annum did not meet fully the personal expense my position imposed. So about July 1, 1916, I was taken over by the Department of Justice and my salary was raised to \$90 per month with a liberal allowance. I received this rate of pay until about the middle of September, 1918, when my pay ceased without being relieved or dismissed from the service, at least I was never officially notified.

I was transferred back to the Interior Department about January, 1918 and served under Mr. Stanley S.Waite, Examiner of Inheritance stationed at White Earth, Minnesota, salary \$90 per month plus allowance when away from my head-quarters which was Cass Lake, Minnesota.

The second call for men to the colors of the United States during the World War affected Mr. Stanley S. Waite consequently about the middle of September he left White Earth, Minnesota for his home in Michigan whence he was to report to the Army. One of the rules under which I was governed at the time, that whenever I had no field work, I was to return to my headquarters at Cass Lake, Minnesota and await for further orders. Accordingly, when Mr. Waite left as above stated, I returned to my headquarters at Cass Lake, Minnesota and awaited for further orders which never came. This was the end of my last classification position until I was reinstated on July 1, 1930. If I was left out of the classified service inadvertently due to the portentous events that transpired at the time and without prejudice, I pray for indulgence in my request.

I may also mention of the fact that if I was left out of the service inadvertently and without prejudice, I was deprived thereby of the benefit of the subsequent reclassification Act of Congress.

T served Mr. S. S. Waite, Examiner of Inheritence, from January 23,1918 until about the middle of September, 1918, when he left in response to the second call for men to the colors during the World War.

I received ninety dollars per month straight and three dollars per diem for board and lodging when away from my headquarters. Cass Lake, Minnesota was designated as my headquarters. When Mr.S.S.Waite left, I returned to my headquarters to await for developements. None came until July first, 1922.

I would be pleased to received credit for the short time I served at the Carlisle Indian School, Carlisle, Pa.

Dear Mr. Burns:

The Department is endeavoring to assemble on the various service record cards the entire record of each employee. In connection with this matter they have called upon us to furnish the complete service of Benjamin Caswell, now employed as junior clerk under your jurisdiction.

We have been able to check Mr. Caswell's record with the exception of a period beginning January 23, 1918, when he entered on duty as interpreter at the White Earth Agency. A part of this time, at least, he worked for Stanley G. Waite, Examiner of Inheritance. We do not have the date his services as interpreter terminated, our first record after that date being July 1, 1922, when he entered on duty as chief of police at the Consolidated Chippewa Agency. Please check your records for the time between January 23, 1918, and June 30, 1922, and give us in detail any services rendered by Mr. Caswell appearing on your record. Also, get a statement from him as to the period he worked for Mr. Waite, giving dates of employment, salary received, and if he worked at a per diem rate it should be shown whether his services were continuous, and if not, the actual dates of employment. We would also like a statement as to the names of the disbursing officers making payment.

In connection with this record we find that a Benjamin Caswell served for a short time at the Carlisle School in 1894, but in a statement on file in Mr. Caswell's record he does not claim credit for this service. Please advise whether this should be credited to him.

- 6. After completing the first page the application must be forwarded to the head of the department, branch, or independent office concerned that the required certificate on page 2 hereof may be duly certified and countersigned.

TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER:

- 7. The certificate of the administrative officer on page 2 hereof may be prepared and signed by any officer who has custody of official records, but it must be countersigned by the head of the department or by one of the assistant heads, and in the case of a branch or independent office of the Government not within the jurisdiction of an executive department it may be countersigned by the head or acting head of such branch or independent office. The authority to countersign, however, may be delegated by the head of the department or independent establishment to some other officer or officers, provided the person so designated files with the Commissioner of Pensions a duly authenticated certificate showing his authority to act. The Commissioner may, in his judgment, limit the number of persons designated in each department or independent establishment.
- 8. The Pension Bureau has a record of refunds paid; therefore it is not necessary to give more information in such cases than as directed in certificate of administrative officer.

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IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Section 10 of the Act of May 22, 1920, provides as follows:

That upon the transfer of any employee from an unclassified to a classified status, or upon the reinstatement of a former employee, credit for past service rendered subsequent to the date this Act shall take effect, or for any part thereof, shall be granted only upon deposit with the Treasurer of the United States of the amount of such deductions with interest as provided in this Act as would have been made for the periods of actual service, or part thereof, for which credit is to be given, but such interest shall not be computed for periods of separation from the service: *Provided*, That failure to make such deposit shall not deprive the employee of credit for any past service rendered prior to the date this Act shall become operative, and to which he or she would otherwise be entitled.

Section 9 of the Act of July 3, 1926, provides as follows:


Beginning with the effective date of this Act, all employees who may be brought then or thereafter within the purview of the Act by legislative enactment, or by appointment, or through classification, or by transfer, or reinstatement, or Executive order, or otherwise, shall be required to deposit with the Treasurer of the United States to the credit of the "civil-service retirement and disability fund" a sum equal to $2\frac{1}{2}$ per centum of the employee's basic salary, pay, or compensation received for services rendered after July 31, 1920, and prior to the effective date of this Act, and also $3\frac{1}{2}$ per centum of the basic salary, pay, or compensation for services rendered after the effective date of this Act, together with interest computed at the rate of 4 per centum per annum compounded on June 30 of each fiscal year, but such interest shall not be included for any period during which the employee was separated from the service. Upon making such deposit the employee shall be entitled to credit for the period or periods of service involved: *Provided*, That failure to make such deposit shall not deprive the employee of credit for any past service rendered prior to August 1, 1920, to which he or she would otherwise be entitled.

Section 12 of the Act of July 3, 1926, provides in part as follows:

In the case of any employee to whom this Act applies who shall be transferred to a position not within the purview of the Act, or who shall become absolutely separated from the service before becoming eligible for retirement on annuity, the total amount of deductions of salary, pay, or compensation heretofore or hereafter made with accrued interest computed at the rate of 4 per centum per annum, compounded on June 30 of each fiscal year, shall be returned to such employee: Provided, That all money so returned to an employee must, upon reinstatement, retransfer, or reappointment to a position coming within the purview of this Act, be redeposited with interest before such employee may derive any benefits under this Act, except as provided in this section, but interest shall not be required covering any period of separation from the service.

A decision by the Comptroller of the Treasury under date of January 15, 1921, states that:

If Government employees desire the benefits of the Retirement Act of May 22, 1920, 41 Stat., 614, upon reinstatement or transfer to the classified civil service, an application should be made by the employee for credit for all prior service since August 1, 1920, and after such application has been granted by the Commissioner of Pensions the employee shall be directed to deposit with any Government depository, wherever he may be located, to the credit of the Treasurer of the United States the sums required to be deposited or redeposited by the Retirement Act to the credit of the retirement and disability fund, and to forward to the Commissioner of Pensions the duplicate of the certificate of deposit issued therefor together with the grant of the application for service credit. (27 Comp. Dec. 623.)

INSTRUCTIONS

1. The act, approved February 14, 1922, prescribes that "each executive department, and each independent establishment of the Government not within the jurisdiction of any executive department, shall establish and maintain such record as will enable it to determine the amount deducted within each fiscal year from the basic salary, pay, or compensation of each employee within its jurisdiction to whom this act applies. When such employee is transferred from one office to another a certified abstract of his official record shall be transmitted to the office to which the transfer is made."

2. A complete official record in the Federal service of the employee named should be set forth on this abstract. If an employee is transferred to another department, an abstract will be prepared in duplicate, showing his appointment in the department from which transferred and all changes of grade or compensation while therein. The original, properly executed, will be transmitted to the department to which transferred, the duplicate to be retained in his personal file. Should such employee be again transferred the second department will prepare an abstract setting forth the data contained in that received by it, with the addition of his record while in the second department, such abstract to be transmitted to the department to which he is transferred, a duplicate being retained.

In the case of a reinstatement, the department in which the employee is reinstated should apply to the establishment in which the former service was rendered for an abstract of record in the case. Statements of employees must not be accepted unless verified from official records.

3. In Table II show the amount deducted for the retirement fund during each fiscal year, or part of fiscal year, the employee was in your service.

4. This certificate must be signed and countersigned (if necessary) by an official recognized by the Bureau of Pensions as authorized to sign certificate of administrative officer on application for refunds.

5. In the case service was per diem and continuous through the calendar year, so state; if intermittent, give dates of beginning and ending of actual employment, with the number of days served.
