

On January 17, 1905, on my recommendation Mr. Charles E. Dagenett was appointed a Clerk to obtain employment for Indians at a salary of \$100 per month and actual necessary traveling expenses, including sleeping-car fare, and a per diem of \$2 in lieu of subsistence, which per diem was increased on July 1, 1906, to \$3.

The appointment of Mr. Dagenett for this important work was experimental. He has been successful in the duties assigned him, and has demonstrated the value of the system. Under his efficient management his field of operations has largely been extended, with a consequent increase in amount of work required.

In order that his efficient services may be properly recognized, I have the honor to recommend that his salary be fixed at \$1400 per annum and \$3 per diem in lieu of subsistence; also that he be allowed his actual and necessary expenses of transportation, including sleeping-car fare and incidentals, payable from "Support of Indians in Arizona and New Mexico, 1907," this increase effective January 1, 1907.





The Secretary of the Interior.

Sir:

On the recommendation of this Office Charles E. Dagenett was appointed, on December 19, 1906, Supervisor of Indian Employment, at a salary of \$1400 per annum, with a per diem of \$3 in lieu of subsistence, and actual necessary traveling expenses, including sleeping-car fare and incidentals; to take effect January 1, 1907 by transfer from "Clerk to obtain employment for Indians."

Mr. Dagenett has heretofore been engaged in the southwest part of the country in the work of promoting industry and securing employment for the Indians of Arizona and New Mexico--his salary and expenses being paid from the appropriation "For support of Indians in Arizona and New Mexico," under authority heretofore granted.

The United States Indian Agent of the Blackfeet Agency, Montana, on April 22, 1907, informed the Office that the Indians of said reservation were sadly in need of work, owing to the delay in the construction work on the St. Mary's Canal, and to their heavy loss of cattle during the last winter. There is also need of

assisting the Sioux Indians in obtaining employment.

Mr. Dagenett has been very successful in the duties assigned him and has demonstrated the value of the system and the benefits thereof to the Indians. Owing to the present condition of affairs among the Blackfeet Indians of Montana and the Sioux Indians of North and South Dakota, it is considered advisable to have him visit the northwest part of the country and undertake a similar work for said Indians.

It is therefore recommended that his salary and expenses, as set forth in his appointment dated December 19, 1906, while employed in securing work for the Blackfeet Indians, be payable from the appropriation "For fulfilling treaty obligations with the Blackfeet Indians," and while employed in similar work for the Sioux Indians, said salary and expenses be payable from the appropriation "For subsistence of the Sioux and for the purpose of their civilization," for the year in which the services are rendered.

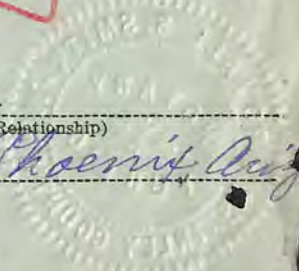
