of Indians in Arizona and New Mexico," under authority heretofore
granted.

The United States Indian Agent of the Blackfeet Agency,
Montana, on April 22, 1907, informed the Office that the Indians of
said reservation were sadly in need of work, owing to the delay in
the construction work on the St. Mary's Canal, and to their heavy
less of cattle during the last winter. There is also need of

assisting the Sioux Indians in obtaining employment.

Mr. Dagenett has been very successful in the duties assigned him and has demonstrated the value of the system and the benefits thereof to the Indians.
