

- 1. Information on file in this office indicates that George Foulk was employed as Teamster in the Interior Department, for duty at the Indian School, Carlisle, Pennsylvania, from April 1, 1882 to October 15, 1918. When the Indian School was taken over by the War Department for use as U.S.Army General Hospital No.31, Mr. Foulk, with other employees of the Indian School, was transferred to the Medical Department at Large. Authority for his transfer was contained in the Department's instrument, dated October 7, 1918, and the transfer became effective October 16, 1918. For some reason, not of record, Mr. Foulk was reported to the Department as a Laborer and the instrument referred to accordingly authorised his transfer under that designation. General Hospital No. 31 was closed as such on June 30, 1920, and on July 1, 1920 the Medical Field Service School, Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania, was established at the same place. This change in the character of the institution did not affect Mr. Foulk.
- 2. When the Retirement Act of May 222,1920, became effective deductions in favor of the retirement and disability fund were erroneously made from Mr. Foulk's pay, it not being understood at the School that the position of Laborer was unclassified and that persons employed under that designation were therefore not eligible to retirement. In view of Mr. Foulk's long service and good record, and in order that he might not be deprived of the benefits of the Retirement Act in his declining years, this office, as a matter of simple justice, by its second indersement of December 1, 1921, recommended that his designation be changed from Laborer to Teamster. This was approved in the Department's letter hither, dated December 3, 1921.
- 3. Notwithstanding the fact that deductions have previously been deposited to the credit of the retirement and disability fund (and have not been refunded to Mr. Foulk) an "Application for Service Credit," Bureau of Pensions form 5-R 32, is forwarded herewith on the theory that this form is necessary to complete the record in Mr. Foulk's case. If other evidence is necessary it will be furnished upon the receipt of advice.
- 4. In view of the statements contained in the basic letter and certificate from the attending physician, it is believed that Mr. Foulk's condition is such as would warrant his retirement and it is therefore recommended that he be retired for total disability in accordance with the provisions of Section 5 of the Act of May 22, 1920. There is also forwarded herewith an "Application for Retirement from the Civil Service on Account of Total Disability," Bureau of Pensions form 3-R 4.




