

Section 1 of the act of May 29, 1930, provides in part as follows:

All employees to whom this Act applies who, before its effective date, shall have attained, or shall thereafter attain, the age of seventy years and rendered at least fifteen years of service, computed as prescribed in section 5 of this Act, shall be eligible for retirement on an annuity as provided in section 4 hereof: *Provided*, That city, rural, and village letter carriers, post office clerks, sea-post clerks, employees of the Indian Service at large excepting clerks, laborers, and mechanics generally, shall, under like conditions, be eligible for retirement at sixty-five years of age, and that railway postal clerks, mechanics, and laborers in navy yards, including leading men and quartermen but excluding master mechanics and foremen, and those employees engaged in pursuits whose occupation is hazardous or requires great physical effort, or which necessitates exposure to extreme heat or cold, and those employees whose terms of service shall include fifteen years or more of such service rendered in the Tropics, shall be eligible at sixty-two years of age. * * * *

All employees to whom this Act applies, who would be eligible for retirement from the service upon attaining the age of seventy years, sixty-five years, or sixty-two years, as the case may be, shall, after attaining the age of sixty-eight years, sixty-three years, and sixty years, respectively, and having rendered at least thirty years' service, computed as provided in section 5 of this Act, be eligible for retirement on an annuity as provided in section 4 of this Act. Retirement under the provisions of this paragraph shall be at the option of the employee; but if such option is not exercised prior to the date upon which the employee would otherwise be eligible for retirement from the service, the provisions of this Act with respect to automatic separation from the service shall apply.

Section 4 provides as follows:

The annuity of an employee retired under the provisions of the preceding sections of this Act shall be a life annuity, terminable upon the death of the annuitant and shall be composed of: (1) A sum equal to \$30 for each year of service not exceeding thirty: *Provided*, that such portion of the annuity shall not exceed three-fourths of the average annual basic salary, pay, or compensation received by the employee during any five consecutive years of allowable service at the option of the employee; and (2) the amount of annuity purchasable with the sum to the credit of the employee's individual account as provided in section 12 (a) hereof, together with interest at 4 percentum per annum, compounded on June 30 of each year, according to the experience of the civil-service retirement and disability fund as may from time to time be set forth in tables of annuity values by the Board of Actuaries: *Provided*, that the total annuity paid shall in no case be less than an amount equal to the average annual basic salary, pay, or compensation, not to exceed \$1,600 per annum, received by the employee during any five consecutive years of allowable service, at the option of the employee, multiplied by the number of years of service, not exceeding thirty years, and divided by forty: *And provided further*, That any employee at the time of his retirement may elect to receive in lieu of the life annuity herein described, an increased annuity of equivalent value which shall carry with it a proviso that no unexpended part of the principal upon the annuitant's death shall be returned. For the purposes of this Act all periods of service shall be computed in accordance with section 5 hereof, and the annuity shall be fixed at the nearest multiple of twelve.

The term "basic salary, pay, or compensation," wherever used in this Act, shall be so construed as to exclude from the operation of the Act all bonuses, allowances, overtime pay, or salary, pay, or compensation given in addition to the base pay of the position as fixed by law or regulation.

Section 5 provides as follows:

Subject to the provisions of section 9 hereof, the aggregate period of service which forms the basis for calculating the amount of any benefit provided in this Act shall be computed from the date of original employment, whether as a classified or an unclassified employee in the civil service of the United States, or in the service of the District of Columbia, including periods of service at different times and in one or more departments, branches, or independent offices, or the legislative branch of the Government, and also periods of service performed overseas under authority of the United States, and periods of honorable service in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard of the United States; in the case of an employee, however, who is eligible for and elects to receive a pension under any law, or retired pay on account of military or naval service, or compensation under the War Risk Insurance Act, the period of his military or naval service upon which such pension, retired pay, or compensation is based shall not be included, but nothing in this Act shall be so construed as to affect in any manner his or her right to a pension, or to retired pay, or to compensation under the War Risk Insurance Act in addition to the annuity herein provided.

In computing length of service for the purposes of this Act all periods of separation from the service, and so much of any leaves of absence as may exceed six months in the aggregate in any calendar year, shall be excluded, except such leaves of absence granted employees while receiving benefits under the United States Employees' Compensation Act, and in the case of substitutes in the Postal Service credit shall be given from date of original appointment as a substitute.

In determining the aggregate period of service upon which the annuity is to be based, the fractional part of a month, if any, in the total service shall be eliminated.

INSTRUCTIONS IN REGARD TO EXECUTING APPLICATION

This application should be filled out, witnessed, subscribed, and sworn to before some officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes. If such officer is not required by law to have and use a seal, his official character, signature, and term of office must be certified by the proper State, county, or city officer under his official seal unless a certificate has already been filed in the Veterans Administration for general reference.

After execution the application should be forwarded to the head of the department or independent establishment of the Government where the claimant was last employed for completion of the certificate on the third page hereof. This certificate must, in the case of the executive departments, be made by the head of the department or by one of the assistant heads, and in the case of an independent establishment of the Government not within the jurisdiction of a department, it must be made by the head or acting head of such establishment. A chief of a division or the head of a bureau is not recognized as having authority to sign the certificate. If, however, the head of a department or independent establishment delegates the authority to sign certificates to a subordinate officer, the Veterans Administration will accord full faith and credence to such certificates.

If the tabulation of service in the certificate of the head of the department or independent establishment (question 6) includes service rendered in some other branch of the Government, the certifying officer should state that such record is based upon a duly certified abstract furnished by the office concerned.

Questions must be answered in full and the answers written in ink, or preferably be typewritten. When the application is completed it should be forwarded by the head of the department or independent establishment concerned to the Veterans Administration, Washington, D. C.

I, Kish Hawkins, employed by the United States as Chief of Police at the Cheyenne & Arapaho Agency, Concho, Oklahoma, being first duly sworn, do hereby depose and state as follows:

That I am making this sworn statement in an effort to establish as near as possible my correct age, in reply to a letter dated January 21, 1932, of J. Atwood Maulding, Chief, Division of Appointments, Mails and Files, of the Department of the Interior.

That I am unable to furnish the exact date of my birth by day, month and year, by either of the first four methods indicated in Form No. 1-031 of the Department of the Interior.

That the reason I am unable to furnish such information in accordance with either of the first four methods set out in this form is, First: Due to the manner of living and uncivilized condition of my parents at the time of my birth, resulted in no public record having been made of my birth; Second, No church record was made of my birth for the same reason; Third, No physician attended my birth for the same reason; Fourth, only one of my parents is living at this time, my mother, Black Head, and she is very old and does not remember the day I was born, and furthermore, due to her uncivilized condition at the time of my birth, she was absolutely unable to make any record of the date of my birth as would be understood in terms of present day methods of keeping dates and records.

That I will endeavor hereafter to establish my year of birth by the only method known among Indians of the Cheyenne Tribe of Oklahoma, at the time of my birth.

That in the summer of 1889, my mother asked Hawk (now deceased), an old Cheyenne Indian, to determine my age by the methods in practice among our people. This Hawk was an authority in determining ages among the Cheyenne Indians, by counting the number of winters, from his remembrance of different important events that happened in each winter from the time of the birth of any child, and thus arriving at the year any child was born. Hawk, the old man, figured out my age as twenty-two (22) years in 1889, counting from three years after the Sand Creek Massacre of the Cheyennes by Colorado Troops under Colonel Chivington, in November, 1864. By this, I determined that I was born in the summer of 1867.

To further support the year 1867 as the date of my birth; in the fall of 1874, when the band of Cheyennes we were with were on the warpath against the United States Government, I was then old enough to ride and travel on horseback, and I still remember

all the different events that occurred and the different country over which we traveled during our flight into the Panhandle country in Texas, whereas, I could not have been old enough to ride and travel on horseback if I was born in 1870, as the records now show, which would have made me only four (4) years old at that time.

The official record of the Cheyenne & Arapaho Agency employees shows my age as twenty-four (24) years on July 1st, 1891, at the time I began my services with the Government at the Cheyenne & Arapaho Agency, Darlington, I. T.

That in later years, I noticed the Cheyenne & Arapaho Agency Census Rolls showed that I was born in 1870, which, I knew was not correct, but which I considered then as not very important, and therefore, did not take steps to correct the year of my birth.

That at the time of my birth there were no birth-day records being kept by a United States Indian Agent, and were not kept for over 15 years after my birth; and also my people were at the time on the warpath against the United States Government, and so, even if such records had been kept by a United States then, there would probably not have been any record of my birth made, as it would not have been known.

That because of the uncivilized condition of my parents, and their utter lack of an English education, that it is impossible for me to determine the place of my residence during the period in which a general census was taken by the United States in 1870, ~~xxxxxx~~ three years after my birth, nor is it possible for me to furnish the names of the County and township or nearest post office from where I was born, as there were no counties or townships or post offices.





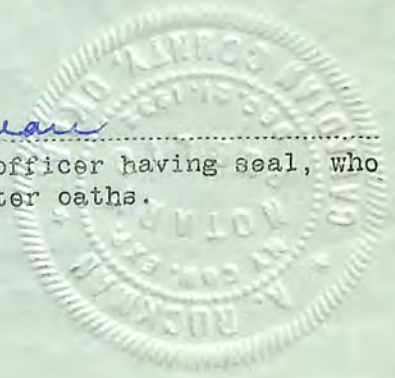

My dear Mr. Bonnin:

The inclosed personal history sheet is returned for completion. In answer to the question "When Born" the month, day and year should appear. Since this ^{employee} is an Indian it is probable that he does not know the date of birth. If such is the case, evidence such as that outlined in the accompanying form should be obtained.

It has become difficult to obtain evidence as to the date of birth of Indians as birth records were seldom made; however, in many cases Agency records are available. An agency record unless it was taken when the child was under ten years of age is of little value. If it is impossible to obtain evidence such as that requested in the accompanying form a statement answering and giving reasons to each question should be submitted.

If the exact date cannot be ascertained it will be necessary to fix an arbitrary date, but that should be done only after every available source of information shall have been exhausted. It is therefore requested that you furnish all possible information from every available source that will help establish a date of birth.

Please give this your immediate attention.

Sir:

As you have had five years of continuous service, under the provisions of Department Order No. 468 you become subject to the Retirement Act and to a deduction of $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent from your gross salary for the retirement fund, effective **April 1, 1931**. Deductions from your salary will commence as of that date.

You can obtain credit for previous service from or subsequent to August 1, 1920, by making the necessary application and deposit. It is optional with you, however, as to whether you do this now, as such credit may be purchased at any time, but the longer deposit is delayed the greater will be the amount to be deposited, due to accumulation of interest. A form of "Application for Service Credit" 3-R 32 is attached, and if you wish to apply it should be executed and forwarded to the Department through your superior officer. The Department will make the necessary certificate and transmit it to the Commissioner of Pensions, who will notify you of the amount necessary to remit.

Should you resign or be separated from the service before you are eligible for an annuity, you may receive a refund of the deductions from your salary by making application on the proper form, which can be obtained from your supervisor.
