Sir:

When the Sioux Chiefs were here last spring on their return trip, American Horse told me that he had the promise of the Great Father to send him one of of our light wagons and several of the other chiefs wanted them. We have four light spring wagons ready for shipment except a little painting and varnishing which can be done very quickly. It seems to me that it would be a good thing at this time to send forward to the Rosebud and Pine Ridge agencies some evidence of the skill of their boys. We have about fifty double sets of harness and about 225 dozen tinware, assored as follows: 97 doz. pint cups, 15 doz. half pint cups, 2½ doz. Qt. cups, 4½ doz. 2 Qt. cups, 27½ doz. Pans, assorted sizes, 22½ doz. Copper pots, assorted sizes and 59 doz. Pails 8 to 14 qts.

I would suggest that the sending of a quantity

of these several articles of our manufacture to these two Sioux Agencies would be advisable as having a counter influence against the death of White Thunder's and Blue Tomahawk's sons and Swift Bear's daughter, though I think these losses are philosophically accepted by them.
