I have

the honor to report that I have examined the scholars recently arrived from the Crooks Nation & find them physically & mentally sound with the following exceptions:-

1. Robt. W. Stewart - age given 18 - which I think correct. The lower portion of right lung has been seriously affected. He says he had Pneumonia a year ago. He seems strong & robust, with no signs of active disease at present.
2. Eliza Chissoe - age given 12 - which I think correct. A limited portion of the lower part of left lung gives some signs of having been affected, probably by Pneumonia; not, however, to such an extent as to lead

me to anticipate any serious consequences.

3. Millie M. Intosh, age given 12 - which I think correct. Some signs given over a limited region of the left lung posteriorly, point to some consolidation, most probably resulting from a previous attack. She seems strong & healthy. I should not anticipate anything serious at present.

4. Ella Moore - age given 13 - which I think correct. The general appearance as well as the signs given upon examination point I think unmistakably to a case of Phthisis, though many of the evidences of this affection are not, as yet apparent. I believe they will subsequently develop.

In regard to the case of Robt. W. Stewart, it is impossible for me to foretell how he may be subsequently affected. His diseased lung may have healed leaving it partially consolidated & impervious - or a destructive process may be started hereafter. Of this, however, I can detect no sign at present. The case should be watched.

In regard to ages, I think the ages of the boys are correctly given, as also those of the girls with the following exceptions

Rosa Ross - age given 12 - would state her to be 14.

Minnie Atkins - age given 16. I should say 18-19.

5- Lizzie McIntosh - age given 15. - should say 17.

This girl's circulation is much under the average being about 60. On exertion heart beats irregularly. I conclude there is functional, but as yet no organic heart affection. Any prolonged overexertion may cause the latter.
