During the prevalence of scarlet fever a number of mattresses were used by the patients. I would recommend that these articles be destroyed to avoid infection.

Others have been so saturated by the nocturnal urination of children as to be too offensive for further use. As they cannot be cleansed they should be destroyed.

They amount in all to thirty-three.
