The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Sir:

Shortly after Spotted Tail returned to his agency last year at the time he had taken his children from this school, I was told by Secretary Schurz that he had asked to return his children to the school and the Secretary said he had informed him that he might do so provided that he returned them at his own expense. The three younger boys were very bright and promising and on view of the services of Spotted Tail for many years and of the fact of his desire to return them to the school, I would recommend that if their relatives are willing the three boys, Collock, Max and Oliver be sent back to the school when opportunity offers of sending them.
