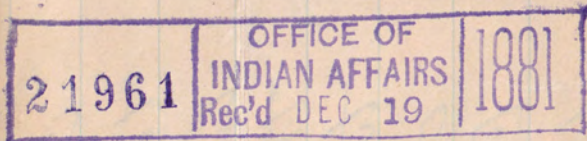
Referring to my Respected Friends letter "F 8857" on the subject of six Indian boys for Emilen Instn. The boys selected by H H Bonwill were not sent on but six much older all of mans size ages over 16 to 20 years, who say they were told they were to go to the Carlisle training school for Indian Youth, we received them in this City & on 10mo 28 they were taken to the Emilen Institution, they were at once dissatisfied with the Colr boys there & commenced to annoy & injure them & do all they can to annoy & insult the female teacher there & have thoroughly disheartened & sicked her, a most valuable woman teacher in the school. They are anxious to go to Carlisle & will not stay at the Emilen Inst. Will you please have them transferred to Carlisle? D. H. Pratt writes he will take them if the Department Consents
