I have five Omaha boys in my
charge here at the Park. They and
their parents and grandfathers for them,
are desirous of receiving an indus-
trial education such as Carlisle School
affords. Can arrangements be made
by which they can be placed under
Capt. Pratt & receive such instruction?
They have all passed a critical
judicial examination, are bright,
active and will I think strive to be
fearful. They are as follows:

- 1 ~~Bert~~ Mitchell 14 years old.
Father dead. Guardian denies education
- 2 Robert Peters 10 years old
Full Orphan. Guardian denies
- 3 Thomas Mitchell 13. years old.
Parents ~~willing~~ and boy came himself.
- 4 Frank Morris 15. years. Came
of his own accord. his parents ~~denies~~.
- 5 Edward Samsoni 12 years. Father
blind, very desiring that boy should go.

Hoping that these children may
be able to go to Central Indian Indus-
trial Training School. And thus ^{be} en-
abled to become useful men and help
forward civilization among their people.
