To the Honorable

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

Washington, D. C.

Sir:

Between this and the 1st of October next, the following pupils who have been here three years at the dates set opposite their names, are entitled to be sent to their homes. Their school period should be prolonged two or three years more. In some cases, I have had letters or messages from their parents indicating their willingness that their children should remain. I would respectfully recommend an office letter to each of the several agents indicating the willingness of the Government to send them home if their parents demand it but recommending that the agent try

to secure the consent of the parents to allow them to remain at least two years longer.

We were very generous last year and sent home a good many who had permission of their parents and who desired to remain at Carlisle. A number of these did not return to Carlisle as was expected and I would recommend that if the Agents secure the parents consent and the pupils wish to remain that it will be best for them not to go until the end of the added period.
