To the Honorable

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

Washington. D. C.

Sir:

A report from my school physician of this date urges that Tommy Mc Gillycuddy and Oliver Spotted Tail, the former from Pine Ridge and the latter from Rosebud be returned to their homes on account of sickness. He states that in Oliver Spotted Tail's case a rapid tubercular affection is manifested and his case is hopeless; - that Tommy Mc Gillycuddy may recover. He says whatever action is taken in regard to the matter should be immediate. The condition of Oliver Spotted Tail, and the want of knowledge of English of the two boys renders it necessary that some one

should be sent in charge of them. The pressing nature of the case admits of no delay to wait for opportunity. I therefore request your authority to send them home, and to send a proper person in charge and to incur the necessary expense. If possible, I will curtail the expense of the person in charge to transportation one way only.
