To the Honorable

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs
Washington D. C.

Sir,

I have the honor to inform you that Fanny Morning a pupil of this school who came last August from Weyenne Agency has been in failing health all winter. The Doctor reports her disease to be Chronic jaundice with a strong disposition to pulmonary trouble, she is not in such health as to be unable to attend school, but it is the Doctor's opinion she should be sent home. We have another pupil who came at the same time from the Kiowa Agency named Kuhakuh a daughter of one of my former Florida prisoners who died of Consumption while east, she is also able to attend school. My Physician thinks she ought to go home. I would request your authority

to send these two profiles to their Agencies and
to pay the necessary expenses of transportation &c.
