Sir

Interpreter Woodward and the 3 Chiefs from the Kiowa Agency leave this morning for Washington. The two Kiowa Chiefs desire me to allow Joshua, one of our students, to accompany them to interpret, as they do not understand or speak the Comanche fluently. They agree to pay his expenses and believing you would not object to his accompanying them under this provision I have allowed him to go.
