Sir:

The departure of James Reubens for Idaho, by authority of the Honorable Secretary of the Interior, has left the Oakland reservation without an Interpreter. I understand that one of the Nez Percé boys now at Carlisle named Luke Phillips could take his place. Under date of 2<sup>nd</sup> ultimo I advised you that the parents of the Nez Percé children at Carlisle wished them all to be sent back to the reservation at the end of present school year. I would respectfully suggest that Luke Phillips be returned immediately, and that I be allowed an Interpreter for the Nez Percé Indians at \$300 per annum.
