Sir

I have the honor to report that I have this day sent Mr. Hugh E. Campbell, farmer at this agency, to Carlisle Penn. in charge of the Crow Youth six girls & five boys - all I could get. Some of those who had promised to go, refused at the last moment. I am in doubt whether Mr Campbell is expected to pay his fare from the money I have furnished ^{him} (on his return trip to this agency) or will he be furnished transportation by the Hon. Commissioner?

Will you have the kindness to instruct him in the matter?

Our physician has been on duty with Special Agent Wilton on the Little Big Horn for several months; consequently, we could not make an examination of the children, but we believe them to be sound physically.

Only two are outside the ages mentioned by the Hon. Commission. They are boys that have been in the boarding school some three or four years ago & I expect good result from their going east.

The young men I was most anxious to send are the ones who refused, so that I had not much choice.
