**TRAINING SCHOOL FOR INDIAN YOUTH,**

**CARLISLE BARRACKS,**

Carlisle, Pa., Apr. 23<sup>d</sup> 1883

To the Honorable

The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,  
Sir:

The period for which they came to the School expired on the 6<sup>th</sup> inst. for eight Menomonees and six Sissetons. I am corresponding with their Agents with a view of retaining some of the younger ones.

We have twenty one Creek pupils whose period expires the 22<sup>nd</sup> of January. Most of these will remain if allowed to, but several will have to go home. I have a Kaw girl whose health requires that she be returned. There will doubtless be others during the Winter. In Feb'y. the three years expire for the sixteen Cheyenne and Arapahoe trade boys. In March, that of the Northern



Arapahoes and Shoshones.

I would respectfully request your authority covering me in incurring the necessary expenses of sending to their homes during the remainder of the fiscal year, all pupils whose time has expired, and for whom arrangements cannot be made to continue longer at the school, and all such as should be returned on account of sickness, not to exceed fifty.
