
Sir: I have the honor to transmit an estimate of supplies, &c., required for the service at the agency under my charge, as above, amounting to \$1196.⁰⁰/₁₀₀, and respectfully ask for the necessary authority to purchase the same⁽¹⁾ in open market

I also ask authority to publish an advertisement, inviting proposals in the case, in the

and to make contract with the lowest responsible bidder, or bidders, for the delivery of the articles estimated for.
