## Indian Industrial School,

Carlisle, Pa., Sept. 3<sup>rd</sup> 1884

To the Hon.

The Commr. of Indian Affairs  
Washington D.C.

Sir:

I forward herewith plans for a building at this school which shall include kitchen, dining-room, Laundry and Sewing room, with Basement sufficient to accommodate our Commissary supplies - Root cellar - meat cellar and Coal bin.

The size of the Main building to be 125 ft. by 50 ft. - the basement 8 ft. high, the 1<sup>st</sup> story, 14 ft. and the 2<sup>nd</sup> story 12 ft. high. The extension in rear of Main building to be 80 ft. by 36 ft. with basement Laundry, Wash. room & Kitchen cellar. The first floor to be for Laundry drying room and kitchen; the second floor for storage & other rooms; with an entry in front of the Main building in which will

be the stairway leading to the second floor. There will also be a stairway from Laundry drying room to the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor.

I propose to make the cellar under the Main building perfectly dry, by grouting it with Mortar and afterward covering it with Cement or some other good material. The building to be of wood.

I have had two of our best building men make estimates - Mr. Samuel Wetzel fixes the lowest cost at \$10,931.<sup>22</sup> and Mr. Jno. R. Turner fixes it at \$10,573.<sup>74</sup>

On going over their estimates I find that by using our own labor as liberally as possible, and putting up the building under our own direction, & using such supplies as we already have on hand, I can complete it without further cost than the sum of Six thousand dollars (\$6000.<sup>00</sup>)

I need not say that this building is now a necessity, and that I cannot

we will longer get on without it. Our dining room is not near large enough, and the building needs to be condemned & torn down. It has stood 19 years, and our Laundry, building, Sewing room and Commissary store rooms are all in the same condition.

I have already talked the matter over with yourself and the Hon. Secy. of the Interior & I believe you concur in the need of it.

I shall only be able to put up this building for the sum named, if I can, as hereinbefore stated, use the labor & material already at my command in the school.

I therefore respectfully request your Authority to expend from my appropriation for the Current year, the sum of Six thousand (\$6000.00) dollars in the purchase of material, under contract where the sum shall exceed Five hundred dollars (\$500.00), and in Open market where it shall be less, and in the payment of such additional labor as may be necessary.

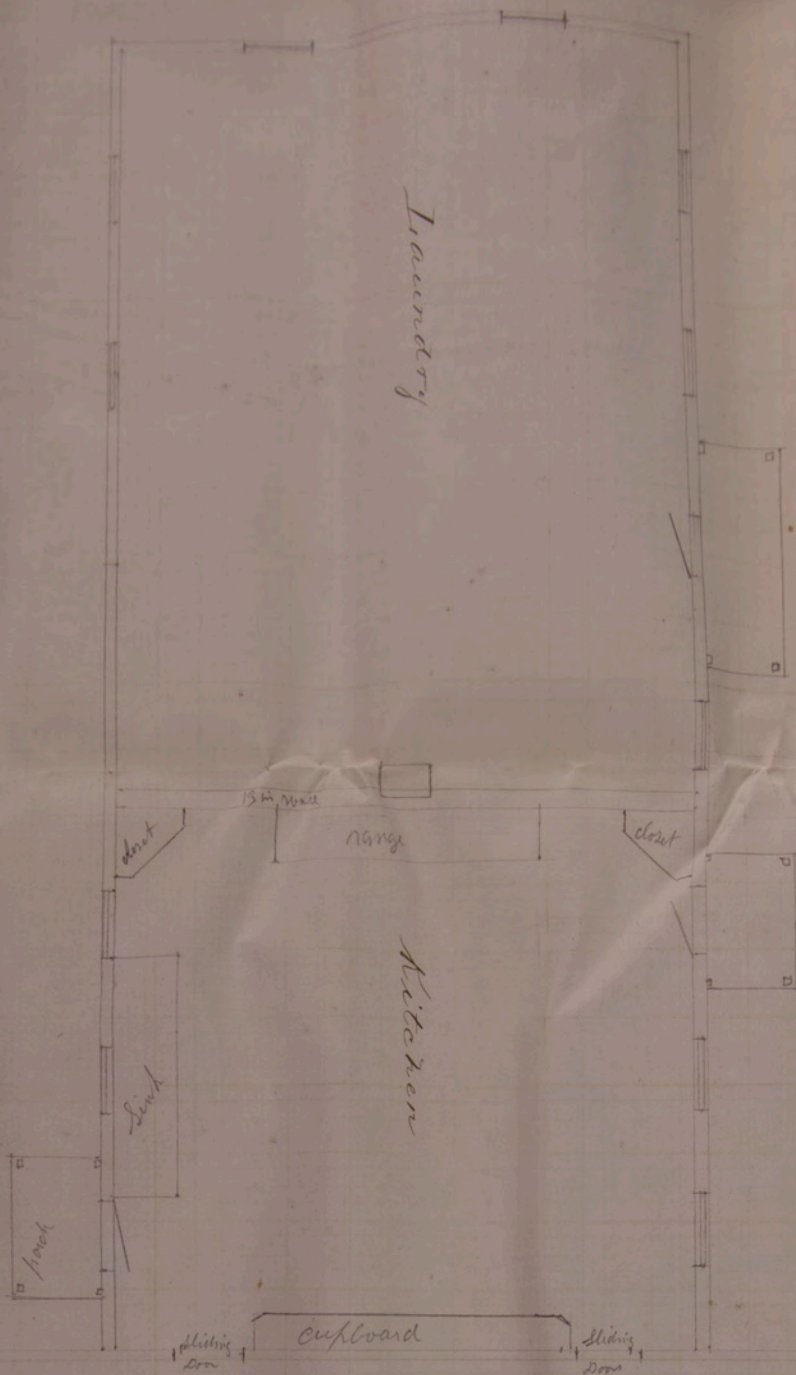

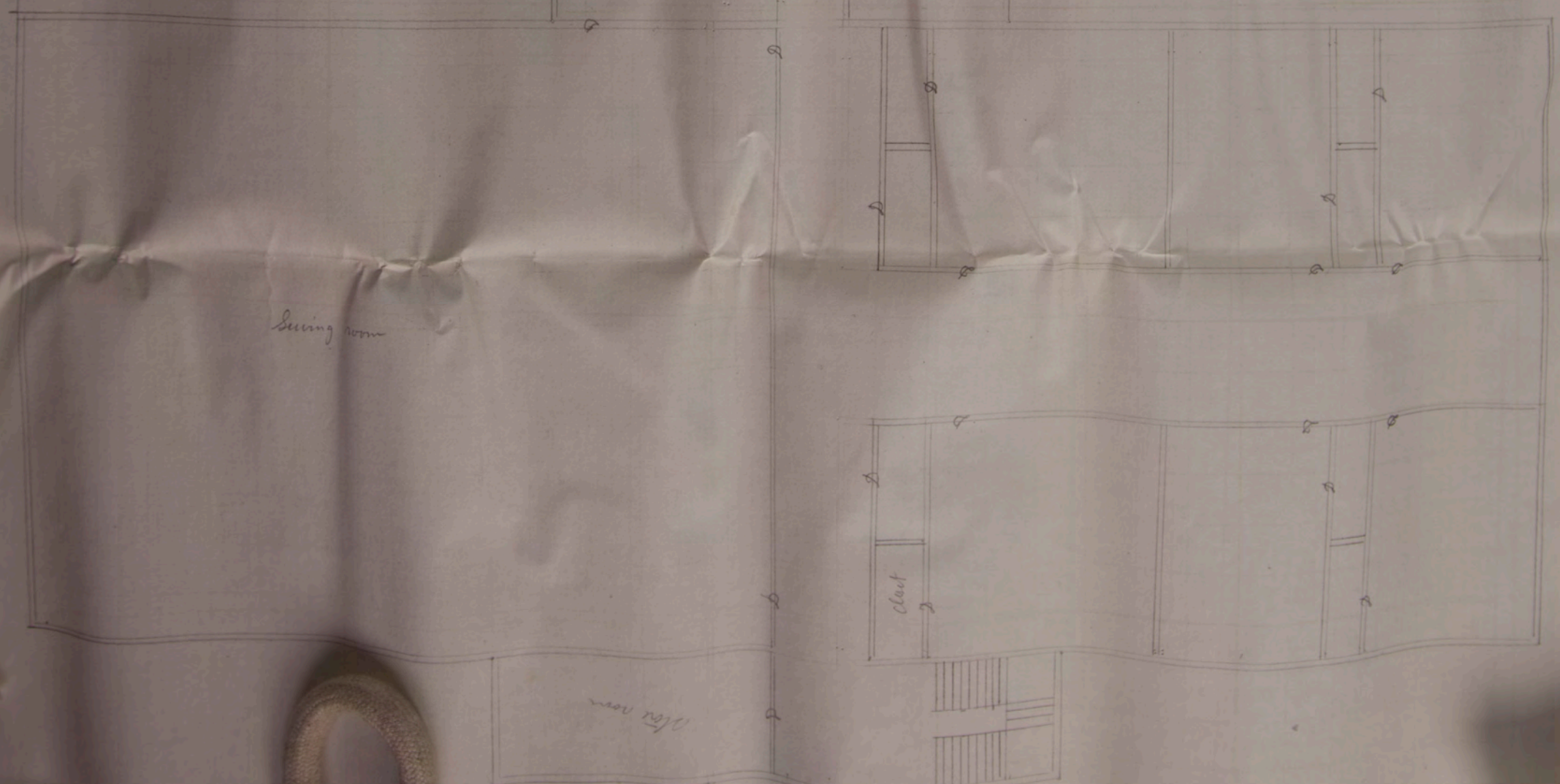
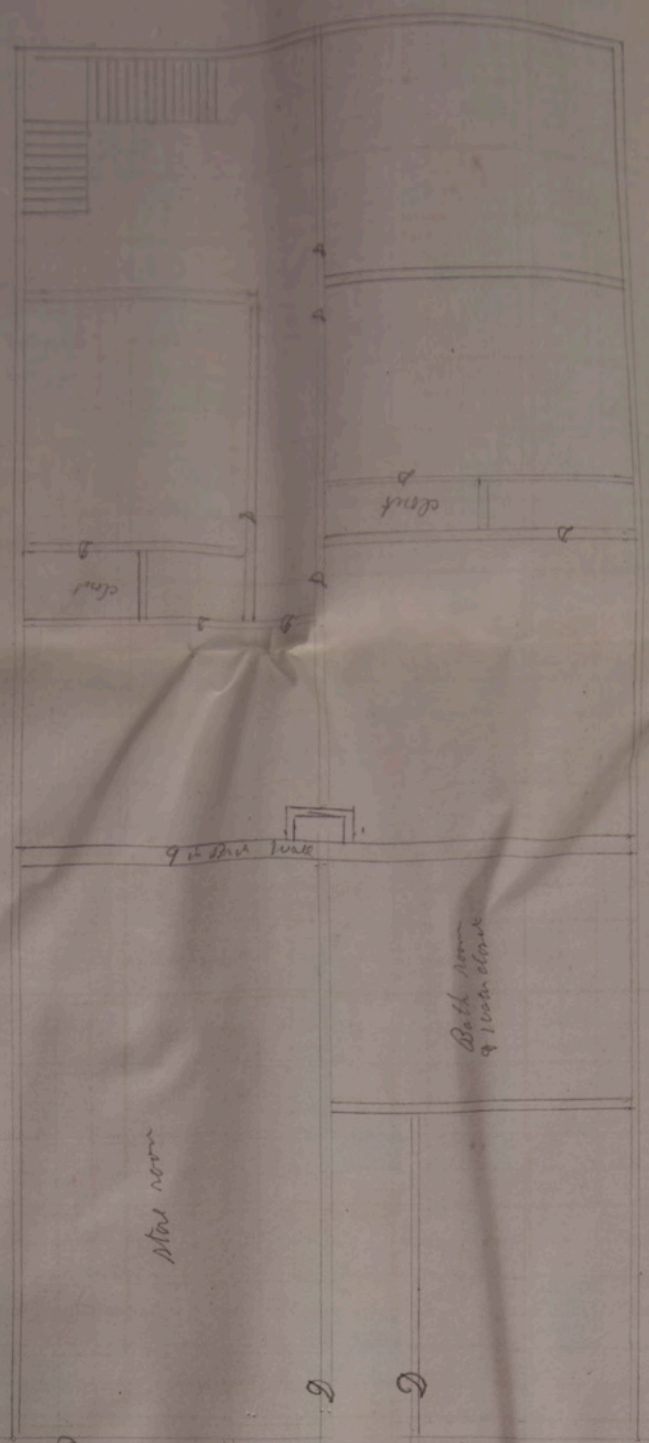


Mining Hall.



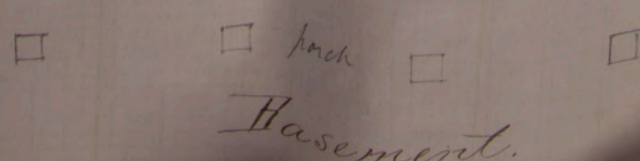
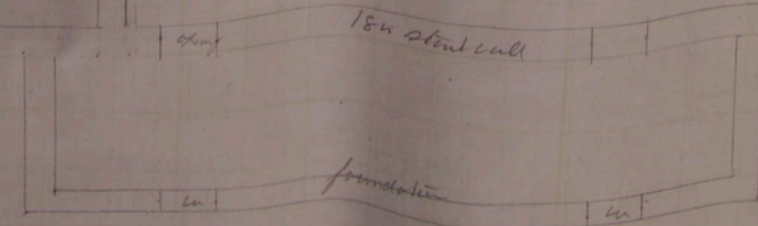
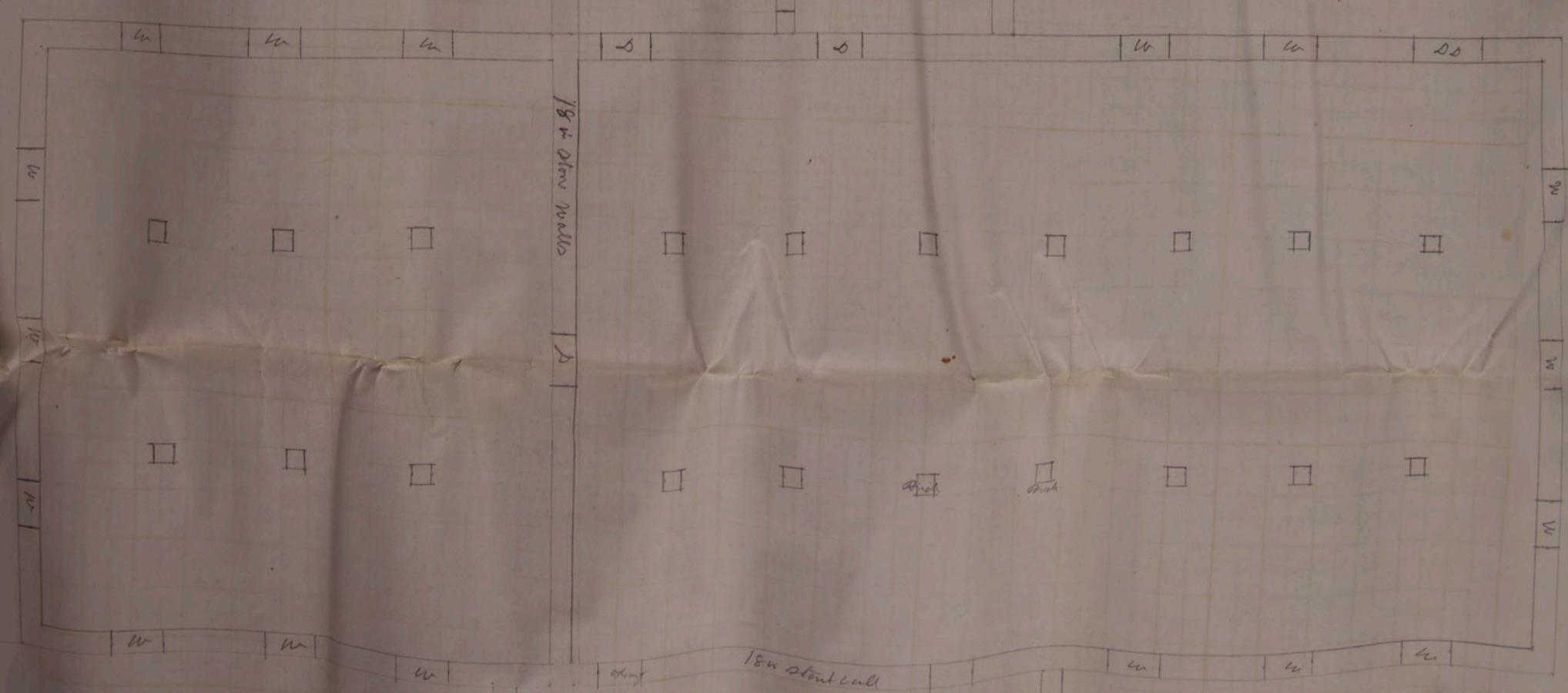
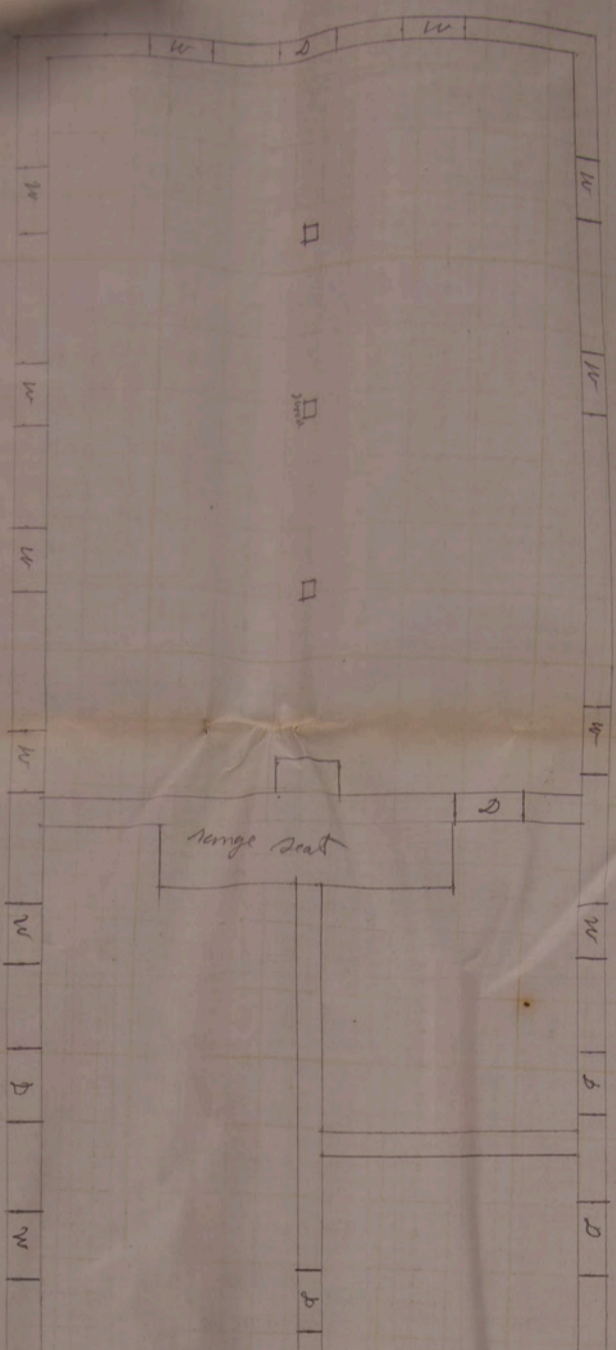
First Floor.

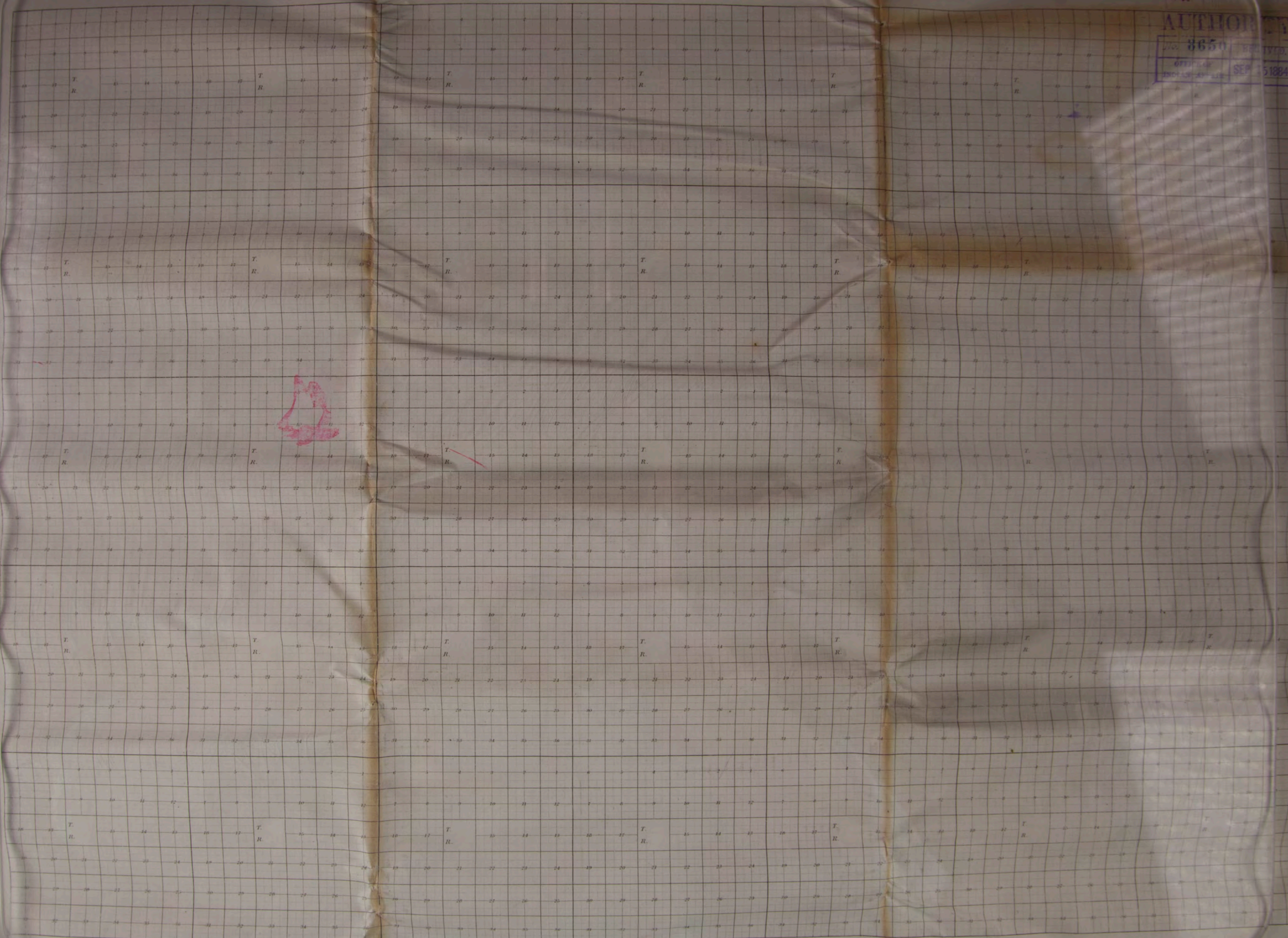
