To the Hon.

The Commr. of Indian Affairs,
Washington, D.C.

Sir:-

We have fifty-eight pupils from the Osages - 45 boys and 13 girls - From ten to fifteen of these should be returned to their tribe on account of health, or other disqualification, and it is my intention to do this at the close of the school year in June.

The Osages are willing and abundantly able to pay for the education of all their children, and as Carlisle has its special appropriation, which will support as many as it can well carry the ensuing year, it occurs to me that it would be economy and good management to send these Osage children to some of the schools for which no special
