Sir:-

Complying with the directions of your letter dated Augt. 24, 1885, Markes C. & C., I have the honor to report that the following irregular labor will be required at this School during the month of September 1885, to wit:-

- Roll of Indian Apprentices manufacturing articles for shipment \$190.-
- One baker - no regular baker being employed - 26 days at \$1.²⁵ per day, \$32.⁵⁰ -
- One Harness maker - no regular Harness-Maker being employed - @ \$1.⁰⁰ ^{per day} - \$26.⁰⁰ -
- One Carpenter assisting in finishing New Dining Hall - 26 days at \$2.⁰⁰ per day - \$52.⁰⁰ -
- One Machinist - removing and setting up boiler and steam drying apparatus and fixing

16 days at \$2.⁵⁰ per day - \$40.⁰⁰
Two seamstresses - making and repairing
clothing for pupils - 26 days each

- assisting in care of large boys at \$10.⁰⁰
One Agent in placing out and visiting
pupils of the school on farms and in
families - 18 days at \$2.⁵⁰ per day

twenty-eight dollars (\$428.⁰⁰). -
