Sir:

In answer to your letter of the 11th inst., marked "Education - 19971 - 1885," I have to say, that the ten Quapaw children are now ready to come, and only await transportation; but the unsettled condition of affairs at the Cheyenne & Arapahoe Agency prevented arranging for more pupils from there, as none returned from the School. If any should come, it will be very late in the Fall; but in the absence of Capt. Pratt I cannot speak definitely of his plans. I would, however, recommend that the Quapaw children be allowed to come as soon as possible.
