The Commr. of Indian Affairs,
Washington, D.C.

Sir:

Responding to your letter of the 29th inst. marked F. I inclose herewith the receipt for ticket as requested.

In reference to the latter part of your letter mentioning that Henry Kendall was sent to Washington without authority, and without funds for his expenses while there &c., I think it but fair to state the transaction as it occurred, viz: Henry visited Washington solely at the request of some Pueblo Indians, through Supt. Bryan, who stated that they were East on their own expense to attend to some matters of interest to them; that they wanted his help and wished him to join them at once. The reasonable

inference from this was, that if they were
 paying their own expense, they would also
 pay his. Had it appeared otherwise
 their request would not have been
 granted.
