Sir.

In reply to your letter of the 11th inst, marked "Education, 6664" in reference to Chas. Martin a Chippewa pupil at this school, whom his father Henry Martin Intersp^r at Leech Lake Agcy. asks you be sent home, I have to inform you that Chas. Martin came to this school on the 11th of Feby 1884, to remain five years. He now says he came because he wanted to, and his father wanted him to come. He says he has not written his father he wanted to come home, and that he does not want to go home until his school period is over.
