In order to facilitate the gathering of a party of youth for this school from the Navajos, I think it best to send Thos. Julius, one of the Navajo pupils at the school, home. He is a man of twenty-five and has some influence with his tribe. His four years at Carlisle have made him a fair sample to induce others.

I request transportation be sent me at once from Carlisle to Manuelito, N. M., for him, and that the necessary and incidental expenses of his journey be authorized.
