Shoemaker 27 days at \$1.<sup>25</sup> per day \$33.<sup>75</sup>; 1 Asst. in Laundry \$12.<sup>00</sup>; 1 Carpenter, assisting in General Repairs 27 days at \$2.<sup>00</sup> per day \$54.<sup>00</sup>; 1 Mason on Repairs 6 days at \$2.<sup>50</sup> per day \$15.<sup>00</sup>, Aggregating \$369.<sup>75</sup>.
