My school physician informs me that Thomas Kester, a Pawnee, and Lena Black Bear, Arapahoe, are both on the downward grade of health with lung disease, and that they had better be returned to their homes. We have been carrying them along through the severe weather, knowing full well that their return in winter would be disastrous - There is good chance in both cases, that a change will be temporarily, if not permanently beneficial -
