Sir,

With reference to the letter of your
Department of the 18th instant, relative to
certain funds due the heirs of Joseph
Batter, and alleged to be held for
them by a German Official in this
city, I have the honor to inform
you that I have received a note
from

from the Minister at his Capital
in which he states that neither
the Legation nor the German Con-
-sulate here, had any knowledge
of the fund in question.

The German Minister suggests,
very appropriately, that steps be taken
to ascertain the name of the
person who made the payments
in 1886, as it is possible that
the fund about which inquiry
is now made may be in
the hands of the same person.
