Carlisle, Pa., Apr. 15. 1887.

To the Hon.

The Commr. of Indian Affairs,  
Washington, D.C.

Sir:-

In reply to yours of the 14<sup>th</sup> inst., marked "A", asking for the present Post Office and telegraph address of this School, and the most direct and traveled route by which it is reached, I have to inform you that both the Post Office and telegraph address is Carlisle, Penna..

Coming from the North, East, or West, the Pennsylvania and Reading railroad lines to Harrisburg and the Cumberland Valley railroad to Carlisle are the direct and most traveled lines. Coming from the South the Shenandoah Valley railroad, connecting with the Cumber-
