Sir;

From this time on it will be necessary to have at this school an assistant seamstress whose duty it will be to take charge of the mending, while the regular seamstress devotes her entire time to the manufacture of new work. Authority was granted me sometime ago to employ an assistant for three months at \$40 per month, and an employe has been placed on duty. From the results of the teaching of Indian Employes who have been trained in Eastern schools, an Indian girl from said schools will fill the position of assistant seamstress creditably to the school, while the cost of such employe will be but half of that required to pay a white person. For that reason, I would ask that the authority for an assistant seamstress be continued the balance of the fiscal year, and that I be permitted to have
