Sir:-

In reply to your letter of Nov. 15th asking information in regard to the advisability of allowing A. Miller's children being sent to the Carlisle Indian Training School, I would state that from the general appearance of the children they are healthy. The mother of the children is dead and the father has been away from home several years. They are living with their Grandfather and have no particular care from anybody. They have attended the day school on the Stockbridge Reservation but have

never attended the McConner Boarding School to my knowledge, nor do I think that it would be of any benefit to send them to that school as they would be so near home it would be almost impossible to keep them from their present associates. I am of the opinion that it would be advisable to send them to the Carlisle school, especially the two girls, as by so doing they would be removed from associates who are of no benefit to Motherless girls, especially members of the Stockbridge Tribe of Indians.
