Sir:

The bearer of this, an Apache named Holiday, desires to be returned to his people of the Kualpai band near Prescott, Arizona.

He was captured by our troops about the year 1864, and when he was very young. He has been employed at the Quartermaster's Corral in this City for the past five years.

If deemed impracticable to send Holiday back to his people I respectfully suggest he be sent to the School at Carlisle, Pa. for instruction in some

trade that would insure his future.
