would ^{you} be willing to authorize such an
arrangement, provided she proves to be
a satisfactory and suitable candidate
for such education?

your power to authorize her education by the government, would ~~it~~ your permission be necessary to her education by private charity?

I shall be much indebted, and will consider it a personal favor, if you will give me an answer to these questions in as short a time as is compatible with your duties and engagements, in order that I may proceed with the further arrangements that may be necessary in either case.
