My Dear Daughter,

from the Clerk Agt. We do not find
out yet. And this what the Clerk Agent
explain to father.

And we also send for you last
summer, that the Agent, and
Supt, of the School, were so anxious.
to have you in Sewing-home,
but as you do not mind, that
work, they took Miss Est Gertie Wild,
you know her, she ^{took} your place,
as a School Seamstress. But while
you there, to work for a while family
you do not get half wages, as Miss
Gertie Wild, receives.
