Pursuant to instructions from the War Department dated May 10th, 1888, the commanding officer Fort Barrancas, Fla., is hereby directed to send *Geronimo* and the other Indian prisoners now at Fort Pickens, under suitable guard, to Mount Vernon Barracks, Ala., where they will be delivered to the post commander. The guard will then return to Fort Barrancas.

The quartermaster's department will furnish the necessary transportation.

The commanding officer Fort Barrancas, Fla., will also send the Indian youths, named in his communication dated April 23d, 1888, to Carlisle, Pa., there to be transferred to Captain *R. H. Pratt*, 10th Cavalry, in charge of the Indian School, who, it is stated, will pay the expense of their transportation.
