I have the honor to submit, herewith, contract in quadruplicate, bond and plans and specifications in connection with a contract entered into between Capt. R. H. Pratt, Superintendent, Indian Industrial School, Carlisle, Pa., and Andrew J. Wetzel, dated the 6th. instant, for the erection of a school building, and to state that on the 12th. instant, this Office called upon Capt. Pratt for an Abstract of Proposals with the result as shown by the accompanying letter.
