I have the honor to state that on the 10th day of July last, two Indian Boys, "Constant Bread" and "Josie Hal-gos-day" arrived at Wilcox A.T. from the Carlisle School Pa. They were provided with transportation as far as Wilcox only and could get no further.

Chas. M. Renand, Quartermaster Agent at Wilcox provided lodging at Wilcox and transportation to Fort Grant as per the enclosed Mem. Bills.

I would respectfully ask authority to make certified vouchers for the payment of \$1.00 for lodging ~~\$2.00~~ \$1.40 for transportation.
