Sir:-

My acting School Physician informs me that Lucinda Hill, an Onida pupil from Wisconsin, is suffering from incipient consumption, and we had better send her home. She will need a ticket from Gettysburg Junction to Dr. Bre. Wisc. He also reports Rhoda Red Wolf, a Cheyenne from Cheyenne and Arapahoe Agency, D.T. in the same condition, and should be sent home. She will need a ticket from Gettysburg Junction to Oklahoma, D.T. Both are large, strong girls with sufficient intelligence to travel without escorts.

I therefore request that I be provided with transportation and authority, covering incidental expenses, and that I be authorized to send the two to their homes at once.
