Sir:

I have the honor to request that the following named pupils at this school be transferred to the Carlisle Penna School, viz: Joseph Banks, aged 20 years; Joseph Morgan aged 21 years; Sam Lewis aged 20 years. All these pupils were brought here, laboring under the impression that trades were taught at this school. They are anxious to persevere in the purpose for which they left their homes. They are very intelligent, obedient, and industrious and will repay any concessions made to them by application and industry.

They are necessarily dissatisfied with the educational conditions of this school. The duties of teacher should

not be interfered with by other duties.

The fact that these pupils desire to continue their educational course speaks volumes in their favor, and their request to be transferred is due solely to the fact that they feel they are wasting time spent here where there is no teacher, no one to instruct them in carpentry or black-smithing, or in the art of the harness-maker. They came here under the belief that such things were taught here and is it any wonder that they are disappointed and discontented?
