My School Physician recommends that, on account of ill health the following named Pupils from Pine Ridge Agency be returned to their homes at once, viz: Geo Little Wound, Lizzie Frog and Adele Tjon. They have scrofula and incipient Consumption.

Lucy Day, of the same Agency, came here Jan. 1. 89. She proves to be a loose, bad character, with two children at home by different men, and is now enceinte by another. Her presence in the School is so objectionable as to require her being sent away.

I respectfully request to be provided with four Railroad tickets Carlisle to Rushville, Neb. for said students, and authorized

to send one person in charge, who will also need a ticket Carlisle to Valentine, Neb., making five tickets in all. Authority covering incidental expenses en-route is also needed.
