Sir

I inclose herewith copy of letter from Agent Baldwin, of Blackfeet Agency, and respectfully invite your attention to a former one inclosed in my letter of March 8th last.

As it will take time to arrange the details of this movement, and the end of the fiscal year is close, so that we may count on availing ourselves of next year's appropriation, I would suggest, if this transportation is left to my management, that I have the authority. If it is to be managed by the Indian Office, I urge that special instructions be
