
Sir:

There is a ruling of the Indian Office within three or four years that the children of the Five Civilized Tribes are not entitled to the benefits of this School. Whether it would be proper to set that aside now or not I am not prepared to suggest

Sir I wish to send two Indian boys & a girl all grown
eventhere to school the next school year, would like them
to go to your school, can I send them there? They are
from a Mission School among the Brecks where I am a
teacher. Are very bright & the girl has a good voice.
Does the Govt support your school wholly? Is it
earnestly religious & of what denomination if any? Can students
attend the ch of their choice? Is music extra? I believe
they learn Manual labor there also? Hope they do. the girl
has some colored blood but is sufficient Breck to entitle
her parents to land in Tex. All are very religious. Are easily
governed, girl about 5th grade in Public school & boys in 6th
boys, one a good printer, other some knowledge of carpentry. All
talk plainly almost as whites I shall feel deeply obliged if you

will ans. my questions by return mail as time is so short
until school year begins & distance so great, Would they have
to pay their own way? I think they could go alone if
necessary, Please tell me all the rules & regulations
of your school; In short please, if you can take them,
tell me so much that we will not need to exchange
letters again to arrange preliminaries, I can furnish any
rec. you ask as to my own good faith & standing &
can have Indians all ready, by Sept. all the Teachers
& Physician if necessary, Please ans. immediately &
oblige A R Boyer as above.
