In the descriptive statement, the SEX may be designated by the letter M for *male* and F for *female*; the RACE by W for *white*, N for *negro*, I for *Indian*, H for *half-breed*, C for *Chinese*, &c.; the correct AGE is to be given when *known*—when it is *estimated*, a line should be drawn under the figures; S designates *single*, and M *married*.

The reports of "Changes in School Employés" are not to be considered as a substitute for "Quarterly Reports of School Employés." The latter must be made regularly and promptly, without regard to these.
