Sir:

Of the six Indian youth brought by Supt. Gerome of Ft. Stevenson, my school physician reports on two as follows:—"Thos. Everett, not well nourished. Says he has never been well." "Always has trouble with lumps," which is confirmed by the others." "Rose Wilde, monthly periods irregular. Has weak eyes. Has had pneumonia, resulting in adhesions." He says that both should have been rejected by the examining physician. Rose Wilde is a candidate for the Hospital now.

Supt. Gerome suggests that we keep them until more serious indications present themselves. My physician recommends they be returned and in this I concur, but am,

of course, willing to do as Supt. Gerome
requests, if the Office think best.

It is fair to say that Supt. Gerome
was not instructed to have a careful
medical examination made and to
reject those unqualified on account
of ill health.
